Joanne served in many positions during her 85 years of life, but her most cherished roles were navy wife and mother. She was on her own for long lengths of time with her children, and during that time Joanne held everything together at home while also serving in countless volunteer positions; however she was a professional as well (bookkeeper, IRS agent, executive secretary, and so much more), even serving a short stint in the Waves. Joanne served her country her entire life, as her father was also in the navy, but her role as navy wife and mom should never be taken lightly. Not just any person (woman or man) has the strength and fortitude for this type of service, but Joanne most certainly did. She was one of the few who served exceptionally well,

even under the most difficult of circumstances!
